# Non-Expo Supplied Booth Signage

With the proliferation of non-expo supplied signs hanging in booths at our shows, we are concerned about our dealers' and attendees' safety due to the limited line of sight for the security personnel guarding the bourse. We would appreciate your cooperation keeping signs hanging no more than two feet below the booth's piping along the back of the booth. There are no restrictions for signs hanging in the back of booths along a wall.

# **Sharing Dealers**

Booths may be shared. However, for safety and security, there is a maximum for each standard booth of three persons, and one sharing company; and a maximum for each corner booth of five persons, and two sharing companies.

dealers who are show exhibitors. Each exhibitor is responsible for the collection, reporting, and payment of taxable sales made during the Baltimore Coin and Currency Convention. In Maryland, there is no sales tax on transactions of coins and bullion over \$1,000. Sales under \$1,000 are subject to sales tax.

The Maryland Department of Revenue sends out temporary sales tax forms to all exhibitors that do not have a Maryland sales tax number. If you are unable to attend or are a wholesale only exhibitor, you are still required to sign and return the form. If you fail to return the form, the Comptroller of Maryland will not issue you a future temporary sales tax number and you will not be able to do business in Maryland. Any exhibitor who does not comply with the laws of the State of Maryland will not be allowed to exhibit at future conventions.

If you have not received your temporary sales and use tax license prior to a show, you may be delinquent in paying sales taxes at one or more past shows. A representative from the Comptroller of Maryland office may attend a show to collect delinquent sales taxes before issuing these companies licenses. At the show, you must be prepared to pay any delinquent sales taxes or provide proof of paid sales taxes for any past show in question. When all tax matters are resolved you will be allowed to setup and sell at the show.

For the Maryland Department of Revenue, please declare the type of business you do at the show. This will ensure that your business is categorized correctly when your temporary sales and use tax license is issued for each show.

## Maryland Trader's License/Exhibitors Affidavit

The Trader's license or Exhibitor's affidavit is not the same as the temporary sales and use tax license you receive from the Maryland Department of Revenue (see above).

In addition, Maryland state law requires that exhibitors have a valid Trader's License or Exhibitor's Affidavit for each show; details are below. At the conclusion of each show, we must forward all Exhibitor Affidavits to Maryland's Comptroller of the Treasury.

To participate in the Whitman Coin and Collectibles Baltimore Expo, an exhibitor must do ONE of the following PRIOR to the start of EACH show: a. Submit a photocopy of a current valid Trader's License for a fixed place of business in Maryland. (You do not need to get another, separate license for the show; a photocopy of your existing license is sufficient.)

- b. Complete an Exhibitor's Affidavit stating both of the following:
  - -- The exhibitor receives less than 10% of annual income from selling like goods at the show.
  - -- The exhibitor has not participated in more than three shows during the previous 365 days.

## 2. Where to get one:

A copy of the Exhibitor's Affidavit is available at whitman.com/expo or upon request.

3. We must receive a copy of the appropriate form PRIOR to the start of the show. Upon receipt of this letter, please send a photocopy of a valid Trader's License OR the completed Exhibitor's Affidavit to info@whitmanexpo.com, fax it to 256-246-1116, or mail it to the address on the front page.
